



The French village of Bessières celebrates Easter Monday by making a gigantic omelet. Made from more than 15,000 eggs, this omelet serves 10,000 people. It takes about 90 minutes to crack all the eggs and about an hour to cook it. The whole town gathers in the town square to watch the preparations and to enjoy the feast. Yum!

To celebrate this “Little Easter,” have a family omelet feast. To prepare, you’ll need two or three eggs per person. Then grate some cheese, dice some tomatoes, cube some ham, and prepare any other ingredients your family might enjoy. Place each ingredient in a separate bowl so that each person can craft their own omelet. If omelets are a new treat for you, here’s a [recipe](#) you can use.
